Course Description:

English I introduces students to various literary genres, as well as writing, speaking, listening, and critical thinking skills. In this resource setting, students will access grade-level North Carolina Standard Course of Study (NCSCOS) content with scaffolded support, accommodations, and individualized instruction according to their IEPs. The goal is to build foundational literacy and communication skills that support academic and real-world success.

Course Objectives:

By the end of this course, students will:

- Analyze literary and informational texts
- Develop evidence-based writing skills
- Strengthen vocabulary and grammar usage
- Participate in collaborative discussions and presentations
- Apply critical thinking strategies to reading and writing
- Use assistive technology and accommodations as needed

Units of Study:

Vocabulary – Weekly Grammar/Fluency – Weekly Foundational Skills – Weekly Non-Fiction Novel Fiction Novel Drama

Instructional Methods:

- Small-group and one-on-one instruction
- Visual supports and graphic organizers
- Audio books, adapted texts, and sentence starters
- Repetition, modeling, and guided practice
- Assistive technology
- Explicit vocabulary and grammar instruction

Materials Needed:

- Notebook to take notes
- Folder with pockets to organize handouts
- Pen/pencil
- School Chromebook or device
- Assigned novels or texts (provided)

Grading Policy:

Your final grade will consist of two components: Classroom and NCFE exam. Classroom work will constitute 75% of your final grade and is weighted as follows:

Daily work 50%
Quizzes 25%
Writing/Projects 25%

The NCFE will constitute 25% of your final grade.

Grades may reflect progress toward IEP goals as well as general curriculum standards.

Expectations

- 1. Arrive on time.
- 2. Do your best, every day, every exercise. Make excellent effort a habit, and excellent results follow.
- 3. Do your work. No internet answers.
- 4. Be prepared for class: Chromebook charged, have your English notebook, folder, and a writing instrument.
- 5. Telephones are to be placed in your assigned slot up front upon entering the classroom, and earbuds/headphones are to be stored in your backpack.
